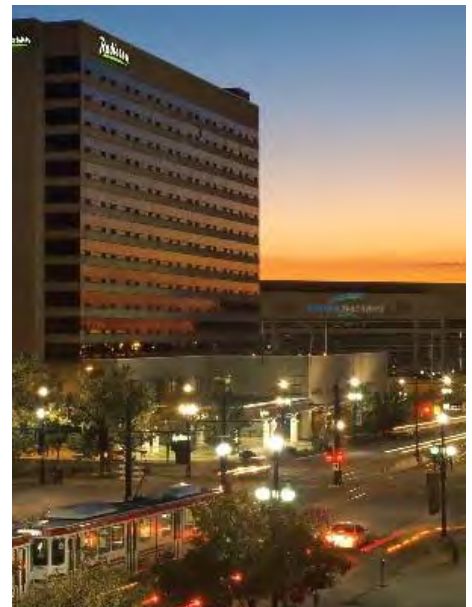
Create a Vision. Make a Difference. Leave a Legacy.
